

Dr. Kenneth Stewart is professor of sociology at Angelo State University. Born in 1949 in Boise, Idaho, he earned a Ph.D. at Western Michigan University in 1975. He joined the faculty of Angelo State University that some year. Dr. Stewart served as Head of the ASU Department of Psychology and Sociology from 1984-94. He teaches courses on social problems, social change and development, political culture in America, diversity and social inequality, social theory, and community development. Stewart has published more than 25 scholarly articles and 5 books on topics ranging from the social history of Mexicans in Texas (*Tejanos*) to current American immigration policy. He has made presentations on his scholarly work in venues ranging from the Texas State Historical Society to the Oxford Roundtable in the United Kingdom. He is founder and director of ASUs Community Development Initiatives, a university program that organizes research and service learning projects to involve ASU students with community partners such as Galilee CDC in innovative efforts to improve the community.
